



(Left) In last month's issue, we left off after gluing the tank tops to the sections of PVC pipe and using cans of V-8 as weights during the drying process.

(Right) This month we begin by constructing the containment fields for each tank. We begin by using .040 Evergreen sheet styrene for the concrete base pad.


(Below) We traced around the PVC pipe section to get the diameter of the original tank structure.








(Above) For the photo, I laid a file down to hold-up the marker strip. We determined we needed a 4-footwide containment field, so we cut a strip of styrene that size, and marked dashes around the original circle. You can also use a compass for this (we didn't have one), then play connect-the-dots.




(Left) Now that we have the diameter of the tank plus containment field, we cut off the excess styrene from around the outer circle.



(Above) Now it's time to glue the tanks to the base. As you recall from last month, we had some difficulty in getting a good, square cut on the PVC pipe sections. Because the cuts are not square, it would make the tank appear to be leaning, because it is. The first step to correct this is using a pair of mini squares, since the tank on the concrete base is now .040" taller that the workbench, we used scrap pieces cut from around the circles to match the height, so the base of the square is flat. This would leave a gap from the concrete pad to the bottom of the tank at some point.

(Right) We made small pencil marks to indicate the gap on the side of the tank. Using different pieces of styrene, we determined the size necessary to straighten the tank and it was glued to the bottom rim of the tank. Don't



worry about gaps at the bottom of the tanks as they will be covered by the containment field.



(Above) The now straight tank is glued to the concrete base.

(Right) All three tanks are on their pads. When doing multiples of the same thing, follow the same procedures on all, even if mistakes are made, then correct them all the same way, so they all look the same.





(left) We are ready to begin constructing the containment fields for each tank. We determined we wanted the field walls to be five-feet tall, so strips of .020" styrene were cut into strips. The entire length of the styrene sheet is not long enough to wrap all the way around, so we will have to splice more in from a second strip. Glue the two strips together while on a flat surface making sure they are straight. Use a "doubler" piece on the inside at the joint.



(Above) To assemble the containment wall, we again used both mini squares, and "Same Stuff" plastic welder. The bottom of the containment wall goes all the way down to the mat and butts up against the concrete pad. Start at one end using the two mini squares to hold the wall strip in place. Use the glue to tack about the first quarter-inch in place and let it set up. Then move both squares about an inch and repeat until nearly around the base. When you have about one quarter of the diameter left, pull the remainder up tight to the starting point, carefully mark where to cut, and cut it a tad long so you can shave it down for a perfect fit.



(Both) The completed containment ring. Now we are ready to add details such as stairs and control valves.






(Left) The stairs were a bit of a struggle to glue in place as they were printed curved and angled in. I found the best installation method was to slip the foot of the stairs into the containment ring to hold it, then position the top of the stairs to a good spot on the top railing, then glue the top section in place and work back down. A small (scale 4-foot) piece of styrene was glued to the containment ring to act as a

landing. Next, we moved on to the control valves which were designed to be attached to the bottom of the tank, but the containment ring prevents this. The control valve section had the hand railing gently removed (to be replaced later) and shortened to fit the containment ring, then glued in place on the side of the tank.

One last item before moving on, the top edge of the PVC tank needs to be puttied and sanded. A small detail sander was ordered and recently arrived, so we will show that next month



(Above) On to another project. The Purchasing Department of the WKR recently purchased a small fleet of better detailed grain cars. One trend of the manufacturers is with cars featuring etched-metal roof walks is to glue the roof to the car. In the past, if you wished to add weight to the car, you removed the roof, glued in the weights, then replaced the roof.

With these new cars, the roof was sealed and could not be removed without significant visible damage. Se the Car Department decided to go "*Back To The Future*" and use an old technique to add weight. From the factory, these cars look great, track well, and are highly detailed, but we consider them to be under the optimal weight. The NMRA Recommended Practices and Standards define a weight system that was developed back in the day when the best wheel sets were Micro-Train plastic units. This level of weight worked well with the rolling resistance of the plastic wheels (which were a lot better than the factory originals).

Now, we have access to highly refined metal wheel sets that offer much lower rolling resistance than the former plastic wheels. This allows us to add much more weight to provide greater tracking and allows the car to act and react more like the prototype. To this end, we use a postal scale, round, split fishing weights, and "Tacky Glue" to add more weight under the car. In this case, we desired three #7 weights in each well, but they would not fit, so we settled on 2-1/2 weights. Some weights were cut in half and glued in the middle. The weights were squeezed shut with pliers, then glue was inserted into the well. Using tweezers, the weights were inserted in the wells, making sure they were balanced side-to-side. After the glue sets, the same body color is painted over the glue and weights. From above or the side you can't see the weights, and the weights are at the lowest point which adds stability. It's not ideal, but it works.



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

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



Free-mo was developed with the idea that a set of standards focusing mainly on module endplates would enable faithful modeling of prototype track plans and operations in a modular environment. The length and track configuration of a Free-mo module or module set is up to the modeler. Free-mo takes the boredom out of running trains monotonously around a double or even a triple track mainline. With Free-mo, less is more.

Free-mo operates like a permanent or sectional layout but still retains its modularity (Free-mo is actually more modular than existing double track modules). Free-mo layouts are operated with a single track mainline in a point to loop, loop to loop, or point to point. Layout sizes can vary to any size conceivable.

Free-mo was developed with the idea that a set of standards focusing mainly on module endplates would enable faithful modeling of prototype track plans and operations in a modular environment. The standards just mandate the ends where modules connect, leaving the length and track configuration up to the modeler. This in turn yields extremely flexible standards that work! For example, if you want to build a module that is 5 feet 7 and 3/4 inches long with an angle of 19 degrees and a 2% grade, you can do it with Free-mo!

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
